DTAS ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2025







Earlier in the week, 26th and 27th August, Michelle J. attended the Development Trust Associations Scotland (DTAS) annual conference. This year the chosen conference venue was the impressive Glasgow Caledonian University (GCU). An apt venue given it's focus on social innovation and their 'Common Good' vision. Michelle J. familiar with the work of Andy Wightman a writer and campaigner on topics regarding land reform, local democracy, economy and environmental issues such as rewilding was delighted to hear him speak on these topics - Michelle J. said 'it's incredibly motivational to listen to a well informed and detailed historical account on how issues around land ownership and local democracy have impacted on our local governance today. It is quite clear that local communities need to give careful consideration as to how best

we can move towards becoming increasingly progressive and

achieve greater benefits at a localised community level'. Michelle J. also attended a number of workshops including The Resilience Toolkit (co-create with us) Development Trusts Association Scotland, Stow community Trust on Nurturing the Ambition of Our Community, Stow Development Trust, Press Pause - do you fel tourism just happens to your community? Can tourism be a force for good? SCOTO - Scottish Community Tourism Network CIC, and Community Climate Adaptation Routemap, Adaptation Scotland Verture and inadvertently ended up giving a group presentation attending the Climate Adaptation Workshop. Moreover, Michelle J. said it a fantastic opportunity to be reunited and catch up with colleagues and friends from other organisations and to also make new contacts as well as replenish her pens and other stationary collection!

Housing Director and KPTDT Trustee Dean Foster was also in the spotlight as he was invited to attend the conference to deliver a workshop on The Future of Community-Led Housing in Scotland - Doing Things Differently alongside South of Scotland Community Housing (SoSCH) and Nith Valley Leaf Trust (NVLT). Feedback received from colleagues attending this workshop said it was really innovative, inspiring and intersting. We have also connected with many other Devlopment Trust organisations from across Scotland and other parts of the UK in both rural and urban communities willing to share their own journey of learning and details of the current priority projects that they are working towards. All in all, a very worthwhile experience for both Dean and Michelle J. who have each come away with so much learning and a wider network of colleagues and access to useful information and resources.

Michelle J. has also been invited to deliver a presentation next week for the Centre for Sustainable Energy. We'll wish her good luck and look forward to hearing all about that in the next bulletin (12 September) when she has returned from annual leave.

COMMUNITY CAFE NEWS

The community Café has had some remedial electrical work done this week which will be finished next week. We have taken this opportunity to get electricity into the community Larder shed in the bike stand area between the café and the garden. This means that we can get a fridge and a freezer in which will allow us to put food into the larder more often. If you have an old fridge, fridge-freezer or freezer that is still working but you no longer need would you like to donate it to the community larder? We can collect.

Only a week to go till the café gets re-decorated. We are still working out if we should completely change the colour scheme or just freshen up what is there. The feedback so far is to keep the orange as highlights and a similar greeny/blue. If you have any suggestions, please let us know.

As with many things nowadays, licences are required for all sorts of things. We have to have a licence to play music in the café and the annual fee is just under £200. After the re-decoration, the Friday Night Tea time club will resume on Friday 26th September with all the popular menu items plus a couple of new ones. On Saturday 27th September something different.
